CALL FOR PAPERS

Conference Theme

"Historically, the humanities have been central to education because they have been seen as essential for creating competent democratic citizens"

Martha Nussbaum

Today, humanistic knowledge continues to provide the ideal foundation for exploring and understanding the human experience. Investigating a branch of philosophy might get you thinking about ethical questions. Learning another language might help you gain an appreciation for the similarities in different cultures. Contemplating a sculpture might make you think about how an artist's life affected her creative decisions. Reading a book from another region of the world, might help you think about the meaning of democracy. Listening to a history course might help you better understand the past, while at the same time offer you a clearer picture of the future.

The aim of this international workshop is to **encourage an academic relationship between Norway and Spain regarding Humanities**. The main objective is to create links, sharing experiences and methodologies among early-career and young researchers, doctoral and postdoctoral students from Norway and Spain. We will share our topic research to approach both realities (North and South). The aim of this conference is also stimulated **comparative research**. Comparisons enable us to clarify cases, phenomena, and subjects by contrasting them with other cases or broader trends. Analytically, the comparative approach is indispensable for asking and answering questions about important social processes and their outcomes

Each researcher will make a short presentation of the topic, objectives, research problems, methodology, bibliography and forward-looking projects about his/her research or PhD.

Abstract Submission

We invite submissions of abstracts for individual paper presentations (10/15 minutes for presentation). The workshop format will be determined by the workshop organizers, taking into consideration the correlation of topics/sub-topics and the number of participants.

All abstracts should include the name, institutional affiliation and email address of the author, the paper title, and academic field or fields (History, Art, Linguistics, Literature...). The abstract should be approximately 300 words in length max.

All abstracts will be reviewed by the conference scientific committee according to the following criteria: originality and/or importance of topic; clarity of research question and purpose; data sources; theoretical approach; analytical focus; relevance of findings if already available. We especially encourage abstract submissions from early-career researchers, including postgraduate research students and postdoctoral researchers.
